# Babergh District Councillor's Report February 2024

#### **Budget Update**

We are proposing to increase Babergh's element of council tax bills by 2.99%, the maximum we are allowed by government – any more would require a referendum to get approval. This is an additional £5.46 to £188.10 a year for residents in a Band D home. Babergh's proportion is only 9% of the total council tax and goes towards providing the many things we do.

Our gross expenditure is forecast to be £25.4m in 2024/25, with council tax funding 26.7% of that. The rest comes from government grants, business rates, fees and charges for services, and investment income.

We will be increasing our council house rents by 7.7% (CPI + 1%) for social rents, equivalent to an average rent increase of £7.92 a week, and 9.4% (RPI + 0.5%) for affordable rents, equivalent to an average rent increase of £11.1, a week.

The budget will be debated by cabinet on 8<sup>th</sup> February and then by council on 20<sup>th</sup> February.

# **Parking Charges**

As agreed by cabinet last month, we are conducting further engagement over plans to introduce short-term parking charges with all town and parish councils, district councillors, and other recognised groups. Engagement is already underway with the directly affected town and parish councils in Sudbury, Hadleigh, Lavenham and Chelmondiston.

Director of Operations Mark Emms is due to contact all other councils via their parish clerks over coming days with further information on how they can also have their say ahead of recommendations going back to cabinet. Please look out for further information soon.
